Mission and Faith Leader

In the Church's liturgical calendar, October is dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary. The version of the Hail Mary we pray today was given official approval in 1568. The Rosary is a powerful prayer and has been attributed to many miracles and apparitions most famously Fatima, Portugal.

Three shepherd children (Lucia, Jacinta, and Francisco) saw a ball of light appear near a tree. Upon closer examination they realized it was a beautiful lady. She told them she was from Heaven and that she wished for the children to come to that same place (the "Cova") on the 13 (beginning June 13th 1917) of the month for the next 6 months. Over the next six months Our Blessed Mother revealed "secrets" to the children. She told the now thousands of onlookers to have a devotion to her Immaculate Heart as well as to practice penance. During the September apparition, more than 30,000 witnessed the sun dim and white roses falling from the sky. Our Lady reminded the onlookers of the importance of praying the Rosary to end the war (WWI). On her sixth apparition, Our Lady identified herself as "Our Lady of the Rosary". It was on this occasion that the most famous miracle of Fatima occurred: before a crowd of 70,000 witnesses, the sun danced.

Drop off and Pick up zone

Reminders to help traffic flow

- When approaching the drop-off pick-up zone, please move as far forward to the furthest vacant space.
- Please do not prop in vacant spots outside the College gate, unless it is the next vacant spot
- When exiting, drive forward through any vacant spaces before you pull out into traffic.

Safety tips for drivers using Drop-off and Pick-up zones

- Always drop off or pick up your child within the designated zone and follow the College's procedures
- Drivers should remain in their vehicles at all times in the Drop-off and Pick-up zone
- Make sure children use the footpath side door to get in and out of the car
- Do not make U-turns
- · Avoid right hand turns into The Parade

Safety tips for students

- Always get in and out of the vehicle on the footpath side
- Stay buckled up until the vehicle has stopped in the Drop-off and Pick-up area
- Be ready to get out of the vehicle with your belongings as soon as possible

Library

Hours of opening

The library is open from:

- Before school 8:00am 8:45am
- Recess 10:40am 11:05am (Recess is for borrowing books and photocopying or printing only.)
- Lunch time 12:45pm 1:35pm
- After school 3:15pm 4:15pm (Monday Thursday)
- After school 3:15pm 3:40pm (Friday)

*Please note that there is an expectation that students will be productively occupied when using the library before or after school.

Loans

Students may borrow up to three books at any time for a loan period of three weeks. Books may be renewed if so desired.

Overdue books

Students are asked to be considerate of others and return items as soon as they are finished with them. If students have overdue books, they should be returned or renewed before any new items are borrowed. Students will receive regular reminders when their books are overdue via a message on SEQTA. At the end of each semester, parents will be notified of outstanding loans.

Lost/damaged books

Students should speak to a library staff member if they have damaged a book or if they think it is lost. Each incident will be assessed individually, but generally, payment will be requested for books that are lost or damaged, so that replacement copies may be purchased.

Photocopier/ printer

Students are credited with \$5 at the start of every term towards their photocopying or printing requirements. Credit amounts may be topped up if necessary by paying at reception.
