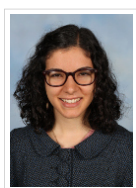

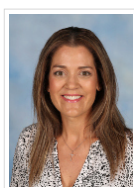

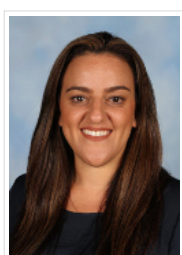

2020 Assessment Re-Sit Policy

With the introduction of VCE Units 1&2 subjects, Catholic Regional College Caroline Springs is required to have a designated time allocated for the re-sitting of School Assessed Coursework (SAC). This allocated time for re-sitting assessment tasks has been made available to all students in Years 7 to 10 across the College to ensure a consistent approach regarding students who are absent on days that Assessment Tasks are completed.

A 100-minute Assessment Re-Sit period takes place each Thursday from 3:20pm - 5:00pm in the College Cafeteria. This Assessment Re-Sit period is supervised to allow for students who have missed in-class assessment tasks to complete these, without the need to be absent for additional class time. Students attending the Assessment Re-Sit are required to be

present until 4:20pm for Assessment Tasks of 60 minutes duration or less, or until 5:00pm, for Assessment Tasks longer than 60 minutes. All parents/carers have been sent a Care Monkey Permission Form for their child to be able to attend the after-school Assessment Re-Sit.

If your child is required to attend an Assessment Re-Sit, you will be notified of this through SEQTA, by no later than 3:30pm the Tuesday prior to the scheduled Thursday Assessment Re-Sit.

If a student is absent from an Assessment Re-Sit, the student will receive a score of 0% for the Assessment Task.

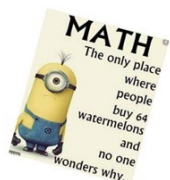
2020 Mathematics

To new students and parents, particularly the 260 Year 7s, we extend a very warm welcome. We are very glad that you have become part of the Catholic Regional College Caroline Springs community and story. We trust that the next four years will be full of positive experiences and wonderful learnings within a nurturing environment. Again, I would urge parents to contact the homeroom teacher if your child's transition this year hasn't

been successful so that we can address any issues as soon as possible.

It was fantastic to see so many parents at the Year 7 Welcome Mass and the Opening of the School Year assembly. At CRC Caroline Springs we actively encourage parents and grandparents to join with us in community celebrations. Our next assembly is an Ash Wednesday liturgy on Wednesday 26 February, and the House swimming sports are coming up on Tuesday 3 March. You are most welcome to attend.

As we have many new families in our community, I would also like to give a few reminders.

Drop-off zone

In 2019 a 2-minute drop-off zone replaced the car parks on College St outside the front gate. It was received very enthusiastically by parents and after some getting used to, became very useful for easing the morning and afternoon congestion.

Hindrances to the smooth operation of the drop-off zone are when parents:

- Stop in the first vacant spot they see and fail to move as far forward to an empty spot
- Park and 'pop into' the office for a few minutes
- Park at the front gate to watch their child enter
- Park and wait for their child after school at the end of the day
- Do u-turns in and out of the zone

Please respect the correct protocols of the 2-minute drop-off zone and it will continue to be an effective way of moving through the school zone. Council parking inspectors regularly monitor the area and significant fines have been issued to parents who do not comply. Please, help each other to avoid that situation this year.

Entering the College grounds

I would also like to remind parents that you may not enter the College grounds with your car for any pick-up or drop-off reason unless pre-arranged with the College. There are clear signs at the carpark entrance gates that request you not to enter. All students should enter and exit the school via the main entrance.

Uniform

At CRC Caroline Springs we prioritise the correct wearing of the College uniform at all times from leaving home to returning home. Please familiarise yourself with the College Uniform Policy and Dress Code via the link below. Students are regularly reminded at school of the uniform requirements, however, it is incumbent on parents to know the policy as well. PHYSICAL EDUCATION, PREMIER LEAGUE & SPORTS CARNIVAL **Footwear!!**

It is vital when taking part in physical activity that **safe and supportive** footwear is worn.

To be deemed as appropriate footwear for physical activity during Physical Education classes, Premier League and Sports Carnivals, shoes must meet the following requirements:

- Have a supportive sole that does not bend or twist
- Have a supportive heel that cannot be pressed in or down
- Be sturdy, arched, outdoor sports runners
- Shoes must have laces and be done up during activity

Some examples of what is **NOT APPROPRIATE** and not acceptable:

- Flat-soled, runner-type, casual, street or skate shoes
- Indoor sport shoes, futsal shoes and flat-soled sport/casual footwear

Photocopier/Printer

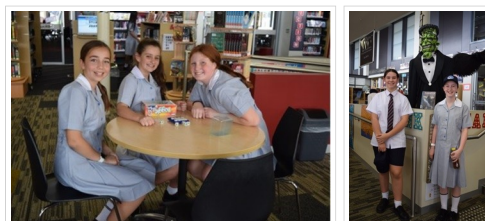
Students are credited with \$5 at the start of every term towards their photocopying or printing requirements. Credit amounts may be topped up if necessary by paying at Reception.
